The Collect

The First Reading

Isaiah 25:6–9 (REB)

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

On this mountain, the LORD of hosts prepares for all the peoples, a rich feast, a feast of old wines, of succulent food, of the finest wines. On this mountain, he destroys the shroud thrown over all the peoples, the pall which covers all the nations: He has swallowed up death for ever. The Lord GOD will wipe away the tears from every face, and the shame of his people, he will remove from all the earth. For so the LORD has spoken. On that day the people will say: See this is our God; we have waited for him and he will save us. This is the LORD for whom we have waited; we will rejoice and be glad in his deliverance.

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

The Second Reading

Revelation 21:1–6a (REB)

A reading from the book of Revelation.

I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had vanished, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the Holy City, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, made ready like a bride adorned for her husband. I heard a loud voice proclaiming from the throne, "Now God has his dwelling with mankind! He will dwell among them and they shall be his people, and God himself will be with them. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There shall be an end to death, and to mourning and crying and pain, for the old order has passed away!" The One who sat on the throne said, "I am making all things new." ("Write this down," he said, "for these words are trustworthy and true.") Then he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end."

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the church. **Thanks be to God.**

The Gospel Reading

John 11:32–44 (TNIV)

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to St John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

When Mary reached the place where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. "Where have you laid him?" he asked. "Come and see, Lord," they replied. Jesus wept. Then the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?" Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. "Take away the stone," he said. "But, Lord," said Martha, the sister of the dead man, "by this time there is a bad odour, for he has been there four days." Then Jesus said, "Did I not tell you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me." When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face. Jesus said to them, "Take off the grave clothes and let him go."

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**
