**The Collect**

**Daniel 12:1–3 (REB)**

A reading from the book of Daniel.

In my vision, the one who looked like a man said to me: "At that time there will appear Michael the great captain, who stands guarding your fellow countrymen; and there will be a period of anguish, such as has never been known, ever since they became a nation until that moment. But at that time your people will be delivered, everyone whose name is entered in the book: many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth will awake, some to everlasting life, and some to the reproach of eternal abhorrence. The wise leaders will shine like the bright vault of heaven, and those who have guided the people in the true path, will be like the stars for ever and ever."

**The Second Reading**

**Hebrews 10:11–14, 19–25 (GNB)**

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Every Jewish priest performs his services every day and offers the same sacrifices many times; but these sacrifices can never take away sins. Christ, however, offered one sacrifice for sins, an offering that is effective for ever, and then he sat down at the right side of God. There he now waits until God puts his enemies as a footstool under his feet. With one sacrifice, then, he has made perfect forever those who are purified from sin. We have, then, my friends complete freedom to go into the Most Holy Place by means of the death of Jesus. He opened for us a new way, a living way, through the curtain - that is, through his own body. We have a great priest in charge of the house of God. So let us come near to God with a sincere heart and a sure faith, with hearts that have been purified from a guilty conscience and with bodies washed with clean water. Let us hold on firmly to the hope we profess, because we can trust God to keep his promise. Let us be concerned for one another, to help one another to show love and to do good. Let us not give up the habit of meeting together, as some are doing. Instead, let us encourage one another all the more, since you see that the Day of the Lord is coming nearer.

**The Gospel Reading**

**Mark 13:1–8 (TNIV)**

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to St Mark.

**Glory to you, O Lord.**

As Jesus was leaving the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher! What massive stones! What magnificent buildings!" "Do you see all these great buildings?" replied Jesus. "Not one stone here will be left on another; every one will be thrown down." As Jesus was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John and Andrew asked him privately, "Tell us, when will these things happen? And what will be the sign that they are all about to be fulfilled?" Jesus said to them: "Watch out that no-one deceives you. Many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am he,' and will deceive many. When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places, and famines. These are the beginning of birth-pains."
